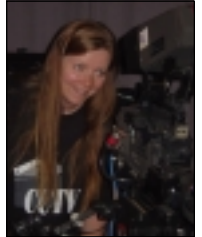

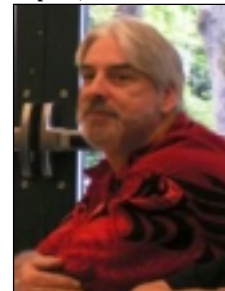

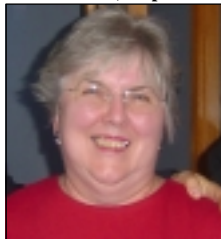

## The "I Want My CCTV" Campaign Needs Your Help!

*Write a letter or make a call and protect CCTV*

Phone companies are asking Congress to eliminate local franchises

They want to sell cable TV *without* having local franchises —as do cable companies

This would hurt our community and imperil CCTV

Telecommunications, cable and media law is due to be re-written soon. Three bills have been introduced to the House and Senate that are bad for our community and bad for community media.

**Senate Bills 1504 and 1349** and **House Resolution 3146** will gut the current franchising authority the Salem City Council and Marion

County Commission have over cable and telephone services.

If passed, these bills will give large telephone and cable operators access to our public rights-of-way in order to operate their businesses without adequate compensation to Salem and Marion County for the use of this publicly owned land. It's just not right.

**By taking action you can protect our community and help keep CCTV on your cable system.**

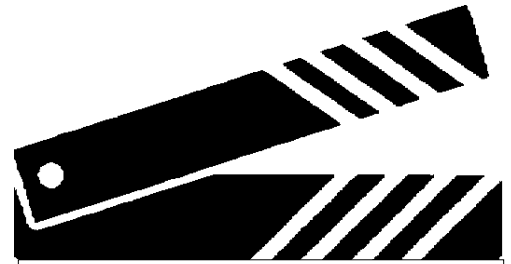

# CCTV AND SALEM POLICE PRODUCE METH VIDEO

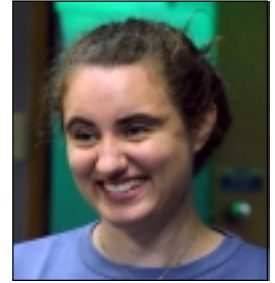
The video shows neighbors how to spot drug houses and work together to stop drug activity

How can you tell if there's a meth house in your neighborhood? Watch the **Salem Police Department's** program, **Safer Neighborhoods: Together We Can Help** and you'll find out.

Plain clothes Salem police officers were videotaped re-enacting drug house activities and behaviors to illustrate what to look for if you suspect a meth house in your neighborhood. The video was produced in both english and spanish, and another version was produced for City employees who work in the neighborhoods.

**Safer Neighborhoods** was scripted by Salem Police Officer Russ Isham and Angie Hedrick of the Salem Community Services Dept., and recorded and edited by CCTV Staff Producer Soha Badiei.

Working with various agencies to produce informational programs for Salem residents is one way CCTV Builds Community Through Television. Currently, Soha is working with the **Salem Human Rights Commission** on a public service message about unfair treatment and discrimination.

CCTV staff Julie Turner and Greg Hiltz really enjoy holding summer video camps for middle school students. They're always thinking of ways to engage young people at CCTV. And this summer they did it with four summer camps: two beginning and two advanced, for a total of 36 students.

CCTV purchased 12 camcorders which allowed each student to work with one. The students learned how to: operate camcorders; edit with Final Cut Pro; plan a program; interview people on the street; write a story about their life then tell it with video; create music, work with a green screen, and choreograph a video to go with their music.

Julie and Greg held premieres of each camp's video in the CCTV studio and gave each student a certificate, a DVD of their work, a T-shirt, a new skill, and a memory of a fun summer.

## LET THEM KNOW YOU OPPOSE H.R.3146, S.1349 AND S.1504:

- **Local cable TV franchises work! Don't "fix" them.** Franchises have benefited our community for many years. *Franchises are fair and make sense.* Any cable TV or phone company can negotiate a franchise and compete. Only local governments can protect their communities (the FCC cannot and will not) and negotiate fair compensation.
- **Commercial-free community TV is valuable and requires cable TV franchise support.**  
The cable franchise funds CCTV, provides Channels 21, 22 and 23, funds the studio, production truck and other equipment and connects public buildings for sending data and commercial-free TV.
- **Phone and cable companies should pay to use valuable local public space.**  
Just like businesses and individuals, local governments deserve the right to negotiate the value of the property they manage. Our governments depend on franchise fees for police, fire and street services in addition to CCTV. Large corporations can easily afford these payments.
